Duties:

- Staff trailhead information tables
- Educate visitors about the natural history and protection of the snowy plovers
- Monitor snowy plovers and nests near trailheads

Benefits:

- Play an important part in the conservation of a federally threatened species
- Add volunteer experience relevant to your field of study to your resume
- Spend time outside in nature!

Training:

One orientation with park biologists in addition to on-the-job training with senior volunteers (TBD: early May). **No prior bird knowledge necessary!**

Time Commitment: At least once a month for a seven hour workday between Memorial Day and Labor Day.
