AUDUBO President's Report with Meeting Minutes

A. Name Change

Since the last Board meeting volunteers have been sent an email regarding the Board's decision to move forward with changing our name to Sacramento Bird Alliance. Mary Forrestal responded to the email indicating the enormous amount of work that will be required to update our website. This work should not fall on Mary to complete! I have been looking for a local website contractor but so far have not found one. If we cannot find a local company then I will start looking for one outside of Sacramento that would be interested in taking on the job.

Our next step on the name change will be to have a volunteer Zoom meeting to vet all concerns and plan out all the task necessary. Mary will be back in the Country this week, so I am planning on scheduling the Zoom meeting during the week of March 4th. If all goes well we can write an article for the April Observer and survey our members in May.

Board Discussion: The Board believes it is best to wait a few months before taking the next steps on the name change. Paul will reach out to John Harding and possibly a website contractor to determine what exactly would be required to update our website. He will also reach out to Mary and Marti to see if they would be interested in being financially compensated for their efforts to update the website.

B. Meeting with Yolo Bypass Foundation

Cliff Feldheim and I attended a meeting with the Yolo Bypass Foundation, CDFW, and Yolo Audubon Society. Garrett Spaan, the new Yolo Basin director provided information about upcoming improvements including roadway and signage improvements. The Yolo Basin Foundation received a grant for a portion of these improvements along with upgrades to their facilities, including a mobile learning trailer. Both Yolo Audubon Society and SAS will have the opportunity to comment and review improvements as they relate to bird watching and conservation.
